#### **GENERAL STATEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES:**

Northland Pioneer College invites applications for an adjunct faculty position in Geography. This position will consist of teaching 3-6 credits per semester: live, hybrid, or online via the institution's learning management system. Responsibilities will include supporting NPC's values: 1) quality learning environment, 2) diversity and accessibility, 3) integrity and accountability, and 4) collaboration toward success; as well as upholding the mission of providing, supporting, and promoting life-long learning.

Successful candidates will teach courses in the accredited undergraduate Social and Behavioral Sciences; teach in a variety of environments and modes (day offerings, evening offerings, online offerings, hybrid offerings, etc.) in accordance with course outlines and instructional procedures; integrate technology with instruction; assess students considering the institution goals, program goals, and course objectives.
