NPC Friends and Family is proud to present The White Mountain Commissioned Officers Association – In the Service of Health Scholarship

This scholarship was established by the White Mountain Commissioned Officers Association of the US Public Health Service. It will provide \$1,000 per semester toward tuition, books, fees and related expenses to a Native American student enrolled in a HEALTHCARE RELATED NPC degree program for the 2025-2026 academic year. Applicants awarded in the fall semester may receive the scholarship in the subsequent spring semester without reapplying, as long as they maintain their eligibility as described below.

Who is eligible to apply?

NPC students from Federally-recognized Indian Tribes: Navajo, Hopi, White Mountain Apache* with a degree plan on file for a health care-related program, who meet the following criteria:

- Enrolled in courses to satisfy the requirements for a healthcare related degree program during the year of award.
- High school diploma or GED at the time of award
- Enrolled in a minimum of six credits during the semester of award
- Cumulative G.P.A of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale
- Not in default of a student loan and not in overpayment status.
- Preference is given to students who can demonstrate financial need.
- Applicant must provide two letters of recommendation with their application

How do I apply?

Submit all application documents as a single, pdf file, to NPCFF@npc.edu

Application documents:

- Essay 500 words or fewer Addressing the following:
 - What are your career goals;
 - What are your educational goals;
 - What resources you have to fund your education making you qualified to receive this scholarship; and
 - Why the scholarship is needed, and specifically how it will be used.

The key to the scholarship essay is that it is a personal narrative, reflecting your experiences and goals. DO NOT USE ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE, SUCH AS CHAT GPT, to write your essay. It is important that your personal voice come through!

- Your unofficial transcript from https://mynpc.npc.edu/ics indicating your degree intent; students without an NPC transcript must submit a degree plan (see academic advisor)
- Two letters of recommendation, (from faculty, staff, or employers) attesting to the applicant's merit for the scholarship

Application Deadline: Thursday, May 22, 2025 at 12:00 p.m. MST., for funding for the FALL 2025 semester.

Applications received after this date/time will not be accepted, regardless of why they are late. You are STRONGLY advised to submit your application well in advance of the deadline date!
