II. Update on Community Learning Programs

- a. <u>Community Classes</u> going strong. Fall 2023 had multiple new classes including Beadwork and Embroidery, Leadership Development, Sound Healing, additional Yoga, Masani Skirt Making, Zumba, and Ribbon Skirt Making. These were in addition to established classes such as Mexican Dance, Gardening, Weaving, Quilling, Pottery, Quilting, Excel, Word, Birding, Canning, Yoga, Welding, Voiceovers.
 - There was a suggestion to do some classes in conjunction with Show Low St. Rita's, OLS Catholic Church which has a full kitchen, and the new Concho Community Center with a kitchen.
- b. <u>Kids College</u> While the popular Video Game Design class and Mexican Dance are our only retuning classes this Summer, we have a few now ones to add. We'll have a new SCC Kids Theater Class doing Seussical the Musical-Kids, A Quilt Camp week of sewing at SCC, Create Camp at PDC, and Wellness Warriors our new Behavioral Health Sciences offerings which boast 36 individual sections of 9 new classes at 3 locations; WMC, SCC, and PDC. The suggestions was made to include 15-18 year-olds in KDC offerings.
- c. <u>STEM Kit</u> Check-out program is mostly paused due to the need for a Coordinator. Sandy offered contacts to get the word out.
- d. <u>Excursions</u> are starting up again this summer with Meteor Crater on June 13, La Posada and Snowdrift Art Gallery on Oct 9th. An August Excursion trip is in the works as well if an indoor venue can be found.
