Introduction

Northland Pioneer College (NPC) is a comprehensive multi-campus community college located in northeastern Arizona. Established in 1974, NPC now has 4 campuses, 5 learning centers, and other delivery sites throughout the service area. NPC provides coursework in Apache County through an annually renewed intergovernmental agreement. Close to 60% of NPC's service area population is Native American primarily residing on the Navajo Nation, Hopi Reservation, and White Mountain Apache Reservation. Of the 21,158 square mile service area, nearly 40% of the land is set aside as reservation while another large amount of land is in BLM or National land, significantly affecting NPC's ability to tax local property. With few exceptions, NPC is the single provider of higher education in both Navajo and Apache counties (Diné College services portions of the Navajo Nation). Distance, poverty levels, and low educational attainment present challenges that NPC will always work with its communities to resolve.

Major Accomplishments in 2022-2023

- Successfully completed two Higher Learning Commission (HLC) site visits, one for additional location visit and the other for NPC's first bachelor's degree program (Bachelor's of Applied Science in Early Childhood Educator). NPC was officially approved to offer this degree by HLC on September 1, 2023.
- Won the League for Innovation Award and the Snowflake Chamber of Commerce Small Business Award for "This Class is on Us," an initiative where each NPC employee can give a three-credit tuition waiver to a new or existing student to help them achieve their educational goals.
- The NPC Friends & Family Foundation has won the Arizona Association for Lifelong Learning's Champion of the Year award.
- Anticipated to receive the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Report for the ninth consecutive year.
- NPC was awarded funding from the U.S. Department of Education for a five-year Title III grant in the amount of 1.6 million dollars to implement A Relational Model for Student Success. One component of this project is the Native American Student Success Initiative aimed at strengthening Native American cultural awareness among students, faculty, and staff and promoting Native American student belonging and connectedness via family events, enrichment programs, special-focus classes, and peer-to-peer mentorship.
- NPC was awarded funding from the Nurse Education Investment Program Pilot grant in the amount of \$402,556 annually for five years to increase the number of nursing graduates and faculty.
- The Nursing program underwent successful ACEN (Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing) national reaccreditation and AzBN (Arizona State Board of Nursing) reapproval for a full eight years (2030). The Nursing Assistant Training program also underwent a successful AzBN program reapproval for the maximum period of two years.
- Completed construction of a Head Start facility at the Little Colorado Campus. The facility provides childcare services on campus for college students with children, provides practicum experience for college students pursuing a career in early childhood development, and better serves the local community for quality childcare.

- Completed the construction of the Skills Center in Show Low with the grand opening scheduled for October 17, 2023. The center provides an ideal space for classroom training and a hands-on learning environment for students seeking skills in three career and technical education programs.
- Made two strategic hires (Associate Vice President for Human Resources and Chief Information Officer).
- Major resources were expended in improving the college's workforce, including the creation and implementation of the new remote/telework procedure/process; completion of a compensation study; expansion and refinement of a formal supervisor training program; moving the Payroll function under the Human Resources department and hiring of the Director of Total Rewards to oversee compensation, benefits, and salary.
- Partnered with Cochise Community College to issue a request for proposal for a new Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system, resulting in awarding Anthology as the college's new vendor.
- Implemented several new systems including Dual Enroll, TargetX, and Ad Astra to enhance student's enrollment experience, improve student success, and provide predictive analytics for course scheduling.
- Continued to improve the teaching and learning technological infrastructure: (1) expanded the Cisco Telepresence classroom technology to five additional connected classrooms for the Business department and Technology Hubs; (2) replaced/upgraded 250+ computers for faculty, staff, and instructional uses; (3) furnished the new Springerville center and WMC Skills Center with state-of-the-art computers, audiovisual equipment, and networking infrastructure.

Major Issues & Resolutions in 2022-2023

- Addressed several areas identified in a 2022 CampusWorks Information Technology audit.
- Hiring the Director of Enrollment Management/Registrar helped address NPC's need to develop its strategic enrollment plan. A Strategic Enrollment Management plan was drafted in the fall of 2023.
- Several software applications (i.e., Dual Enroll for high school student registration, Ad Astra for course scheduling, and Target X for recruitment) were purchased and implemented to resolve NPC's operational efficiency issues associated with high school student registration, course scheduling, and recruitment.

Upcoming Issues for 2023-2024

- Implementation of the new Anthology ERP system that will impact the entire college; NPC will continue to partner with Cochise Community College for implementation.
- Implementation of many strategic initiatives and potential restructures may bring about significant change management concerns.
- Assess the feasibility of upgrading existing microwave tower equipment to enhance reliability and expand bandwidth for campus and center connections.
- Continuing to pursue student enrollment and completion targets; enrollment drives state appropriations as well as spending limitations associated with the Expenditure Limit.
- Improve onboarding of new hires and concerns associated with ongoing role-based professional development for both new and existing hires.
- Preparation for HLC's Year 4 Assurance Review and potential site visits associated with the proposed offering of two new bachelor's degree programs.
- Planning for and anticipating programmatic adaptations to meet the redesigned Arizona General Education Curriculum.
- Continuing to strengthen communication practices across the college to develop relationships and foster collaboration.
