- b. SSA No update
- c. TAS Update Scott Estes (information)
 - i. Student Email
 - There is currently no procedure for student email; student email is for life, it is never deactivated by NPC
 - 2. NPC has been using Gmail for 10+ years
 - a. Currently 70,000 Gmail accounts
 - b. Less than 20,000 have ever been accessed
 - c. Less than 2,000 have been checked over the last year
 - 3. TAS looking for guidance from IC or LTC on email
 - a. Need decision on:
 - i. Whether we continue using email as student communication
 - 1. Our communication methods need to mirror the real world and provide options for students with different preferences.
 - Students use their student email to sign up for other sites, like FAFSA, to reinstate or find a lost password goes to that address, for job searches, etc.
 - 3. RAVE communication and Jenzabar use email
 - 4. Google Docs is widely used by a lot of our students which they access through having these email addresses
 - ii. If so, do we deactivate after a certain time/inactivity period?
 - Perhaps a policy of deactivation if dormant for certain amount of time
 - With all of the new technology platforms available, we need to determine a streamlined communication plan for all communications and communication technologies.
 - c. Need to make sure in our communication with students through email that we are verifying the student information to stay compliant with FERPA.

4. Curriculum

- a. ACRES
- Concern raised regarding the department a course is housed in being changed through a course modification form
 - a. Moving ECN 211 & 212 from A&S to CCP using Course Modification form which has never been done before
 - b. Concern about moving these ECN courses would move NPC away from being able to hire an ECN instructor
- 2. ECN should be a social science not a business course
 - a. It varies between institutions where these courses are housed
 - b. Part of this is being driven by AZ State Legislature requirements
- Should this procedure be a program modification as opposed to a course modification

- a. ECN is not a program, thus it would not go on a program modification form
- b. This issue is relevant to the following proposals:
 - Math classes from 112 (excluding Business Math, which was voted on previously), HES 101, and ECN 211 and 212
- 4. What is gained by changing the departments?
 - At least for ECN, no one in A&S is qualified to teach these courses, develop the curriculum, participate in AZ Transfer meetings on an articulate level in terms of ECN 211 and 212
 - b. Our most qualified faculty who have been teaching these courses are business faculty with MBAs
 - c. Budget reasoning, need to fund faculty to teach these courses out business dept it is hard to justify that much of a faculty load coming out of budget when it has no impact on the department enrollment during a time when enrollment is down
 - BUS dept goal is to build the ECN enrollment up to where a PT Economist/PT Business Statistician could be hired on
 - d. Whatever the process, just needs to be good reasons for changing the departments because that can affect hiring practices, who does the hiring, who is assessing, who is overseeing the curriculum, and for quality control purposes it needs to be the subject experts
 - e. Programs vs departments vs prefixes language confusion
 - Department field needs to be reduced to match actual departments that exist at NPC
 - 1. Departments would then have prefixes that they are responsible for
 - 2. Where a class belongs is where the subject matter experts are for a particular institution
 - f. ABUS degree is where the ECN course is necessary
 - g. Request to Proceed type proposal and discussion moving forward for these types of changes
 - h. Proceed with these changes and then create a more formal process going forward
 - Somethings are not ICs job to decide and some attendees and IC members objected to IC voting on which dept courses are housed; not everything regarding structure of the college is housed under IC; this is a curriculum group not an administrative group
