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Introduction

Northland Pioneer College (NPC) is a comprehensive, multi-campus community college located in northeastern Arizona. Established in 1974, Northland Pioneer College now has four campuses, five learning centers and numerous other delivery sites throughout the service area. Northland Pioneer College provides coursework in Apache County through an intergovernmental agreement renewed annually. Close to sixty percent of Northland's service-area population is Native American primarily residing on the Navajo Nation, Hopi Reservation and White Mountain Apache Reservation. Of the 21,158 square mile service area, nearly forty percent of the land is set aside as reservation while another large amount of land is in Bureau of Land Management or National land, significantly affecting the College District's ability to tax local property.

With few exceptions, Northland Pioneer College is the single provider of higher education in both Navajo and Apache counties (Diné College serves portions of the Navajo Nation). Distance, poverty levels, low educational attainment and limited infrastructure present challenges which Northland will always work with its communities to resolve. Northland is committed to serving many future generations of students in the service area.

Major Accomplishments in 2010-2011

- Awarded \$1.9 million for a five-year development grant under Title III, A (NASNTI)

- Maintained high student satisfaction in all service areas despite diminished capacity and resources
- Held first annual joint district governing board and legislative summit in cooperation with Coconino and Mohave Community Colleges
- Successfully implemented two new retention strategies
- Initiated new transfer agreements with Prescott College, ASU and NAU
- Redesigned Cosmetology program to improve student/institutional outcomes
- Upgraded Internet connectivity from 10Mbps to 100 Mbps with increased redundancy
- Increased wireless network coverage at all locations
- Implemented Adobe Connect
- Upgraded network infrastructure
- Began implementation of a new college-wide reporting tool (Argos)
- Started on a five year project to revamp use of the ERP/SIS system for increased efficiency and effectiveness
- Complied with HEOA Peer to Peer File Sharing requirements
- Upgraded e-mail server and added clustering for availability and disaster recovery improvements
- Integrated internal Help Desk and Field Technician areas to improve efficiency
- Added technology resources to more classrooms, including smart boards, overhead projectors, computers, and document cameras
- Entered into instructional and technology related partnerships to maximize use of resources

Major Issues & Resolutions in 2010-2011

- Scope and role of Shared Governance discussed and clarified with the development of a new procedure
- Addressed workforce development and job training, both capital intensive programs, with renewed focus on community and industry input
- Provided institutional operational resources for adult and developmental education to replace loss of state funding
- Responded to competing community concerns regarding tuition increases and property tax increase versus demand for services and course offerings by taking a balanced approach
- Created an Institutional Effectiveness Department to respond to data needs, including new or revised data collection for Arizona Community Colleges Strategic Plan
- Identified soft capital and deferred maintenance needs to be incorporated into future budgets

Upcoming Issues in 2011-2012

- Increasing financial aid applications
- Reduction in program offerings as a result of significant JTED and K-12 budget reductions
- Implementation of new Shared Governance Procedure
- Redesign and approval of construction technology program
- Decisions on high-cost CTE programs
- Assisting students to adapt to an educational model more focused on distance delivery of programs and services
- Staffing challenge – difficulty replacing key personnel due to salary range and location
- Adapting to a new phone, fax and unified messaging solution
- Transitioning to new HLC Criteria and accreditation model
- Aging technology infrastructure

Credit courses

IN-STATE - \$60 per credit hour.

OUT-OF-STATE - \$100 per credit hour for 1 to 6 hours. \$295 per credit for 7 or more credits. .

SENIOR CITIZENS – Arizona residents 60 years or older may qualify for tuition at 50% of the applicable rate: (Does not apply to non-credit courses)

NEW MEXICO Residents – Students with an approved waiver pay resident tuition.

REQUIRED FEES - \$35 Media fee required for all students enrolling in three (3) or more credit hours.

LATE REGISTRATION FEE – Students registering for class on or after the start of the first class meeting will be charged a \$25 Late Registration Fee, which is non-refundable.

Non-credit courses

There is no tuition charge applied for non-credit courses. Each course is set at a rate that fully covers compensation for instructors plus an overhead contribution for planning, administering, and publicizing the courses to the community.

Some classes require a materials fee in addition to cost associated with the class.







15-1427. Annual report

A. By December 1 of each year, each community college district shall make a report for the preceding fiscal year to the governor, the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives and the joint legislative budget committee and shall provide a copy of this report to the secretary of state.

B. The report shall contain the following information regarding the operation of the district:

1. The state of progress of the community colleges operated under this chapter.
2. The courses of study included in the curriculums.
3. The number of professors and other instructional staff members employed.
4. The number of students registered and attending classes.
5. The number of full-time equivalent students enrolled during the year.
6. The total number of students not residing in the district.
7. The amount of receipts and expenditures.
8. A general description of tuition and fees charged for credit courses.
9. A general description of tuition and fees charged for noncredit courses.
10. Such other information as the governor and the joint legislative budget committee deem proper.

C. In each odd numbered calendar year, the report shall also contain the following information regarding dual enrollment programs operated pursuant to section 15-1821.01:

1. Documentation of compliance with the requirements prescribed in section 15-1821.01, paragraphs 3, 4 and 5, including a list of the members of the faculty advisory committees of each community college.
2. Total enrollments listed by location, by high school grade level and by course.
3. A copy of each addendum to intergovernmental agreements or contracts executed pursuant to section 15-1821.01, paragraph 1.
4. Summary data by community college district and by individual community colleges on the number of scholarships or grants awarded to students.
5. Such other information as the governor and the joint legislative budget committee deem proper.
