



A Relational Model for Student Success (ARMSS)

Year 2- Belonging Student Survey

For Fall 2024 registration, Northland Pioneer College developed a short survey for students to voluntarily complete after visiting with an academic advisor. The ARMSS grant has one strategy focusing on relational advising to promote a student's sense of belonging at NPC. The purpose of this survey is to measure Fall 2024 NPC students' attitudes regarding belonging and self-efficacy. This survey will be repeated each semester during the life of the ARMSS grant, providing data to evaluate if relational advising impacts a student's sense of belonging and self-efficacy at the aggregate level.
